### Little Indians Re-opening Health and Safety Protocols

The Little Indians Preschool will follow the Collier County District Academic Calendar, continue with operation hours from 7:00am-4:00pm, along with all health and safety protocols established by CCPS. The following protocols will be in place on the students first day and remain until otherwise directed by Collier County School Board.

#### HEALTH AND SAFETY PROTOCOLS

- Social Distancing
  - Utilize physical classroom space to distance students as best as possible.
  - Eliminate students rotating to centers, and bring center to students.
  - Space tables out and limit the number of students at each table.
  - Cots will be assigned to students and spaced out during nap time.
  - Maintain low enrollment of students to assist with providing space for students to distance.
  - Drinking fountains will be turned off.
  - Students can bring a personal water bottle and use the refilling station within the classroom.
- Face Coverings
  - All students and staff will be expected to wear a face covering on school campus. Face coverings prevent the spread of coronavirus.
  - Face covers must be at least two layers thick, and adhere to School Board policies 5511 (Student Dress and Grooming).
  - Face Coverings will be worn at all times while at iTECH, EXCEPT while socially distanced eating (lunch, snack, etc.) and rest/ nap time.
- Preventative Measures
  - Handwashing and hand sanitizing time will be built into the student scheduled day
    - Entry to school
    - Transition times between recess, snack, lunch, etc.
    - After use of the restroom
    - Before leaving the classroom for the day/dismissal
  - School supplies will be issued to individual students, eliminate share supplies.
- Cleaning Protocols
  - Removing items that have porous or fabric covered surfaces.
  - Disinfecting all frequently touched surfaces in school and for all shared objects.
  - Providing general-purpose cleaner in every classroom and administrative area.
  - Following cleaning protocols for when a student or staff member tests positive for COVID-19.
  - Continuing to replace quality air filters in our HVAC systems
- Visitors to Campus
  - For student drop off and pick, parents will utilize the Video Doorbell system at the entrance of the Early Childcare Center. Parents will not be permitted to enter the Center.
- Signage throughout the School Campus
  - Handwashing
  - Face Coverings
  - Directional Arrows
  - Social Distancing Reminders

- WHEN SHOULD YOUR CHILD STAY HOME?
  - Student Sickness- if your child has any of the following symptoms:
    - fever
    - cough
    - shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
    - chills or repeated shaking with chills
    - muscle pain
    - headache
    - sore throat
    - unidentified rash
    - congestion or runny nose
    - nausea, vomiting, or diarrhea
    - new loss of taste or smell
- Student Exposure
  - if your child has been in contact with someone with COVID-19
  - OR
  - if your child has been tested for or under investigation for COVID-19
- Handling Reported Illnesses
  - Students
    - Students showing COVID-19 symptoms at school will be placed in an isolation room or area to keep separated from others; parents will be notified immediately.
    - The area will be reopened after it has been sanitized.
    - CCPS will notify health officials, staff, and families of a possible case while maintaining confidentiality as required by the Federal Education Records Privacy Act (FERPA).
- Handling Positive Cases
  - Despite all precautionary measures, there is always a risk of exposure to communicable diseases. The following will be followed when a student or staff member is reported as a positive case of COVID-19:
    - Should a student or employee contract COVID-19 and expose others, CCPS will immediately notify ONLY those who are/were at risk of exposure due to privacy and confidentiality which are protected under law.
    - CCPS will follow guidance from the Florida Department of Health - Collier regarding close contact exposure:
      - Someone who was within 6 feet of an infected person for at least 15 minutes without protective face covering starting from 2 days before illness onset (or, for asymptomatic patients, 2 days prior to specimen collection) until the time the patient is isolated.
    - Students or employees who have been potentially exposed will be sent home, asked to isolate (on a case-by-case basis), and recommended to get tested for COVID-19.
    - The workspace(s) will be disinfected
